- 2 social studies credits, one of which must focus on Canadian social studies:(CAS401A, GEO421A, HIS421G, LAW521A, LAW521F, LAW531A, HIS621A, HIS621B, or POL621A).

Graduation Requirements current 10's and 11's

- 1 physical education credit (PED401A).*
- 1 career education and personal development credit (CEO401A).*

Reminder of Update last year.

- **Honour Criteria - To be recognized as an PSB honour graduate, a student must:**
- Successfully complete the Provincial Graduation Requirements and;
- Achieve an aggregate of 480 (80%) in six, (6) Grade 12 courses (600 and 800 level), one of which is English; and
- No mark lower than 70% in the six (6) Grade 12 courses included in the aggregate calculation.

Transitions Program

Page 5 & 39

- Offered in 1st semester only, full afternoons.
- Opening it to grade 11 and 12's this year.
- Must have good attendance/effort in current classes.
- If you are planning on going to Holland College, you absolutely must consider this course.
- Holland College adds points to your application if you have this credit.
- Need your own transportation from Holland College at the end of the day.

- Students registering for Transitions need to fill out the application (YELLOW form).
- The students will hand the completed application form to their homeroom teacher with their registration sheets.
- Students cannot take TRA602Y and CWS502A/602A due to scheduling conflicts.

Co-op Work Study Program

Page 5 and 38

- Grade 11 – 502A & 502B
- Grade 12 – 602A & 602B
 - A = 1st semester B = 2nd semester
- Full afternoon programs...transportation to work place in the locations of Cornwall, Charlottetown, and Winsloe areas will be provided, students need their own transportation from work placement at the end of the day.
- Must have 6 credits, good attendance and work effort in prior courses and fill out/hand in the contract form.
- Students cannot take TRA602Y and CWS502A/602A due to scheduling conflicts.

Co-op Work Study Program

Page 5 and 38

- Students registering for Co-op must complete the contract (GOLDENROD form).
- The students will hand the completed contract form to their homeroom teacher with their registration sheets.
- Students cannot take TRA602Y and CWS502A/602A due to scheduling conflicts.

Peer Helping Peers

- Students registering for Peer Helping must complete the application (BLUE form) and get an “unofficial transcript” from Elizabeth Orr in the Counselling center. This transcript requested must be made by 11:00am Tuesday, April 25th, 2017.
- The students will hand in both the completed application form and the unofficial transcript to their homeroom teacher with their registration sheets.

All Year Courses

- Students must register for 2 of these
- If they qualify, (administrative approval) you can also back your all year course with a study period (in grade 11/12).

Study Periods

Page 7

- In order to have a study period in the following grades, students must have already earned a certain number of credits
 - Study period for students registering for Grade 11
 - must have at least **8 credits**
 - Study period for students registering for Grade 12
 - must have at least **15 credits**
 - All study periods must be approved through the Administration

COURSE SELECTION

- Choosing the right courses at the proper level is vitally important for all students.
- You must take care when transferring your registration information from your official form to MyBlueprint.
- You should not expect registration changes to be possible after June 30th.

COURSE SELECTION CONT'D

- The following are a few basic guidelines to assist in this area:
- 1) Choose subjects at a level which will offer appropriate challenges. Students who have had success in academic programs/courses (70% or higher) to this point and good study and work habits will most likely find continued success in academic courses.
- 2) Ask questions of your current teachers and school counsellors.
- 3) Select courses based on future plans.
- 4) Attend meetings about registration.

French Immersion Certificate

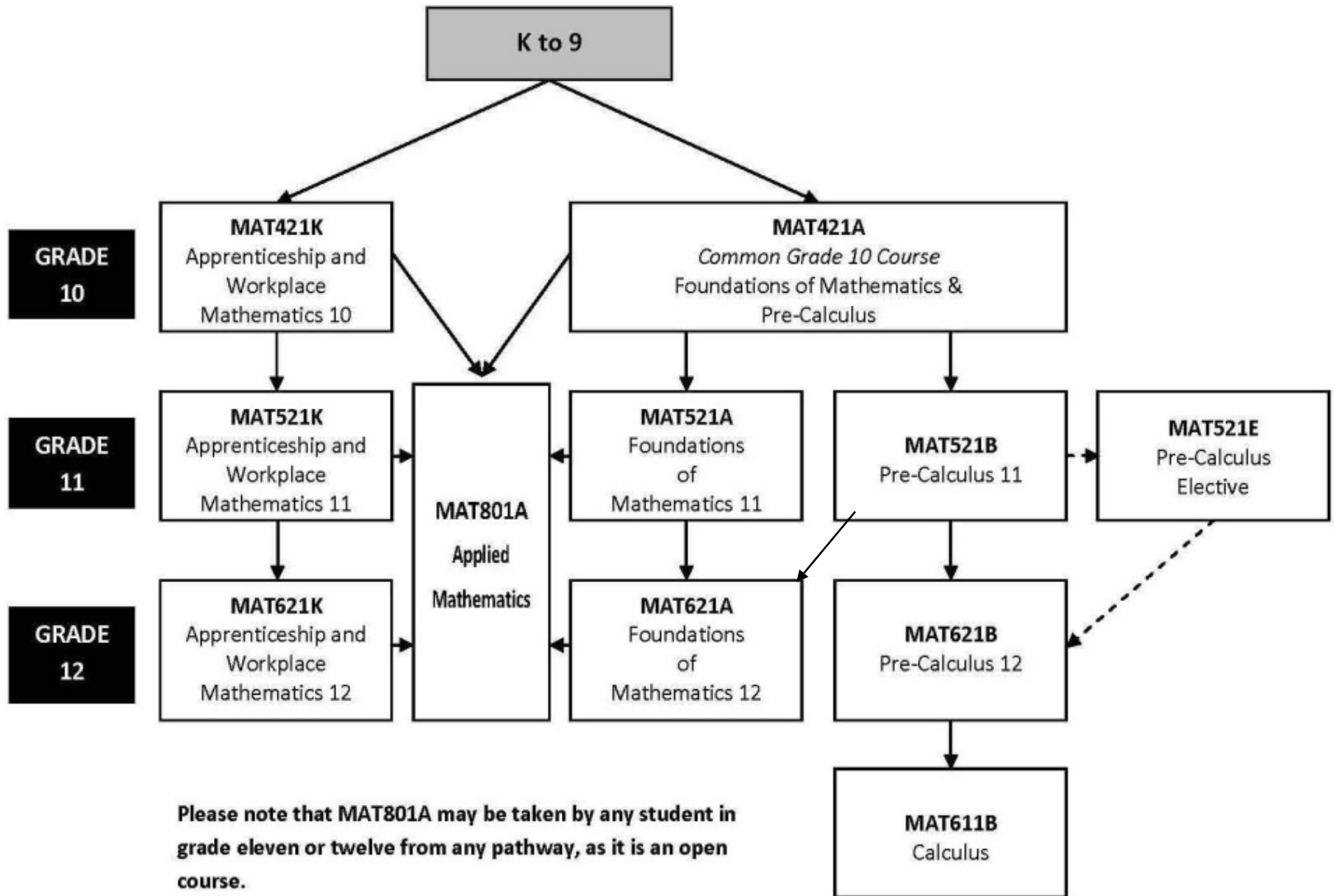
- 6 courses must be completed in French Immersion (2 in each grade).
- 3 must be French Immersion Language Credits.
- It is required that students take 1 French Immersion course each semester.
- Students are required to complete 2 courses each year.
 - FRE 421F HIS 421G
 - FRE 521F LAW 521F
 - FRE 621F SOC 621F

Please pay attention to the code, French Immersion courses have an F, but a G for history.

French Immersion Certificate Cont'd

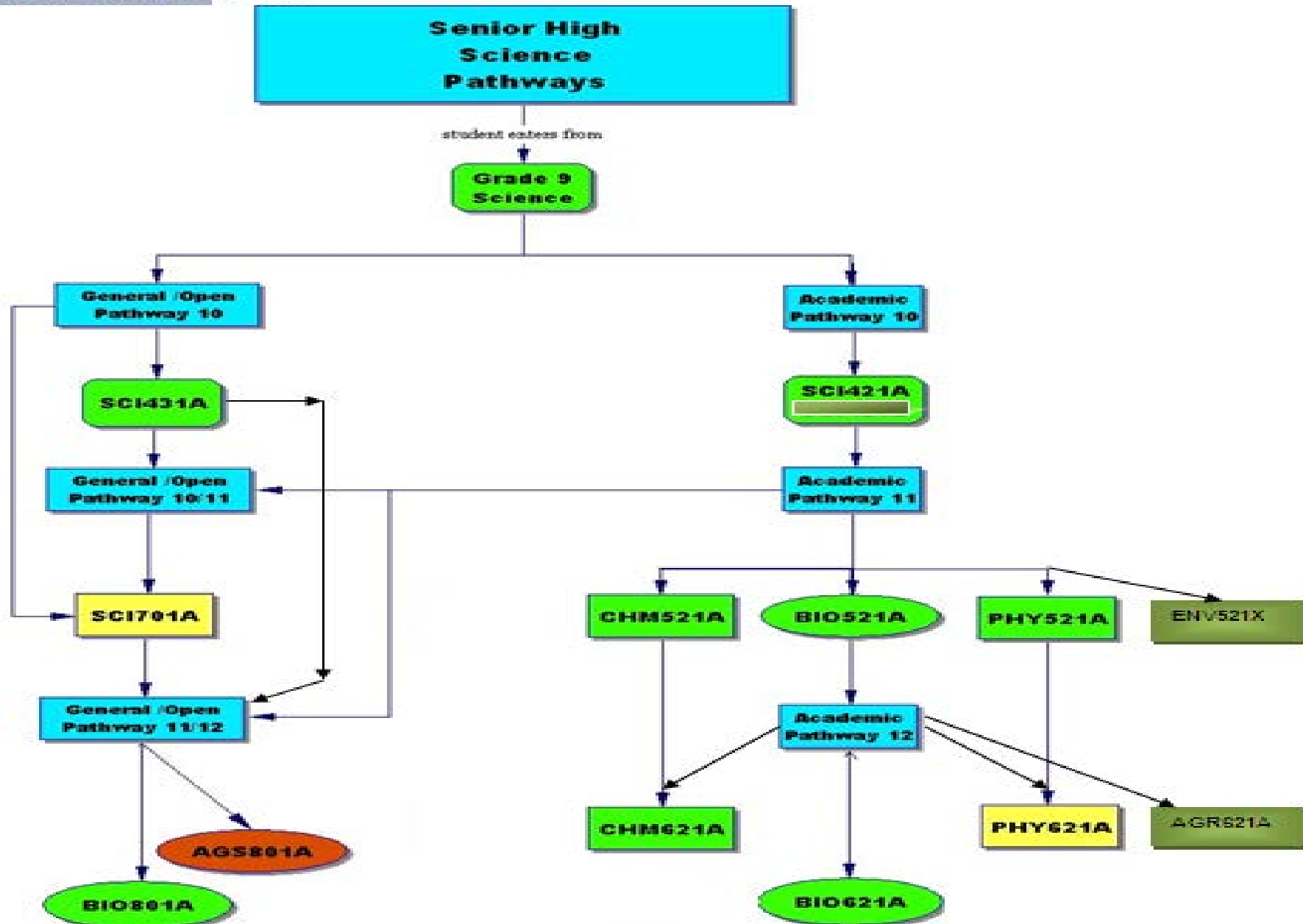
- The D.E.L.F is an international French language proficiency exam for grade 12 students, there are two levels B1 and B2.
- The students are tested on written comprehension, oral comprehension, written production and oral production.
- The D.E.L.F. assessment will be available to all FSL students that have completed **at least one FSL Grade 12 level course.**

Important Notes pg. 4

- It is difficult to register successfully for Automotive, Welding and Carpentry in the same year due to schedule conflicts.
- If registering for automotive, welding, and/or carpentry, you must register for the 701A versions before any other.
- Automotive 801C has strong math component – meant for students going into a engineering/electrical field.
- Carpentry 801A & 801C – you must register for both of these at the same time. Offered all morning in 2nd semester.

Important Notes pg. 5

- If you enrol in a course you already have the credit for due to **upgrading**, you will only be awarded **one** credit.
- Students who attain credits at the same grade and subject level but different curriculum levels will count towards two credits. One towards the compulsory credits and one towards the elective credits. Eg. SCI421A and SCI 431A. (In this case, the SCI 421 would be counted as the Compulsory credit and the SCI 431 would be considered an **elective** credit.)

Important Notes pg. 6

- DRA621A, ART621A, CMP621A, and any of the shop classes that were listed in slides 29-31 with stars are run as independent courses. You need to understand this when registering, and you need to be committed to the work involved in a course that has little teacher involvement as they are all offered at the same time as other courses.

- ◎ NOTE: Students cannot receive credit for each of the following pairs of courses, as they contain a significant number of outcomes that are in common:
 - MAT521A and MAT521B;

Important Notes pg. 8

- *ECO621A is a dual credit course with Holland College.*

Dual credit is a course where students earn both high school and post-secondary credits concurrently for the same course. Students who have completed ECO621A with a grade of 60% or greater, will be exempt from taking the equivalent course at Holland College (BUSI 2030). BUSI 2030 is a course found within the following Holland College programs: Business Administration, Accounting Technology, Marketing and Advertising Management, and Sport and Leisure Management. Students will also be exempt from any fees related to this credit. See pg 27.

Important Notes pg. 9

- *ACC621A is a dual credit course with Holland College. The Department of Education, Early Learning and Culture and Holland College recognize Accounting Principles - ACC621A as a dual credit course. In the simplest of terms, dual credit refers to a course where high school students earn both high school and post-secondary credits concurrently for the same course. Therefore, all students who have successfully completed ACC621A, and have achieved a grade of 60% or greater, will be exempt from taking the equivalent course at Holland College (ACCT1001). ACCT1001 is found as either an elective or a core course in the following Holland College programs: Golf Club Management; International Hospitality Management; Marketing and Advertising Management; Tourism and Travel Management; Sport and Leisure Management.*

Important Notes pg. 10

- A student who has an accounting at the grade 12 level must have permission to take the other grade 12 level accounting course.
- Students who have this year's CUL 801A can apply for CUL 801B
- PED801A is a much different type of course than PED401A.

Registration Forms

Between now to Wednesday, April 26th

1. Sign up for **8** courses in **order of preference** plus **2** alternatives, be sure to choose these alternatives wisely as you may end up registered in them on rough copy (**cherry colored**).
2. You **MUST** fill out the “Alt 1 and Alt 2” section
3. Ensure that you have all the prerequisites for the courses you have chosen.

Wednesday, April 26th

1. Transfer your information from your rough copy (yellow) to your good copy (**white coloured**) and sign it.
2. Have me check your good copy form, and I will sign it and photocopy it.
3. Take home your form and get a parent/guardian signature. – **Hand this back to me tomorrow, Thursday, April 27th.**
4. **We will enter it into My Blueprint together at a later date once all forms are back, do not register on MyBlueprint until I inform you to do it.**
